My high school son Sage and I were blessed to be among the Wings volunteers who participated in the Wings Party at the Santa Fe prison last Saturday. For us it was a four hour trip up there, and a four hour trip back, and it was well worth it.

Wings uses the LOGOS process with prison families. These are families where the kids do not have regular contact with their dads, do not live in 'normal' families, and have the added stigma of having an inmate for a parent. The Wings Parties give them an opportunity to experience a loving and supportive Christian community modeling a relationship with a loving and caring God. They get an opportunity to BE a family again. Wings helps build relationships, and as a person who believes incredibly in the strength and grace of relational ministry, I think this is incredibly important.

Sage will, as his Boy Scout Eagle project, be implementing a Wings Party at the state prison near our town. I can think of few greater gifts from a LOGOS child than to pass LOGOS on to younger children whose lives are full of pain and turmoil. Once he completes that I'll try to expand it to the Federal prison that is also near us.
